WALKER OF BOWLAND PAPERS. Correspondence and papers, private and official, of Brigadier-General Alexander Walker, from ca.1790 to 1831. The collection covers Walker's military and administrative service in the East India Company in great detail from ca.1790 to 1801, notably in Malabar and then in Gujarat, where he was Political Resident at Baroda, until he left India in 1810. He came out of retirement to govern St Helena from 1822 to 1828. The importance of the collection lies in the detailed administrative content of Walker's correspondence and memoranda, particularly for the Gujarat period, a continuing concern for Indian affairs throughout his retirement which led him to maintain or create a wide range of correspondents, and his passionate interest in native customs and traditions which involved him in the collecting of copious materials intended for publication. There are also some papers relating to his small estate at Bowland, near Galashiels, acquired in 1810, and some papers, after his death in 1831, relating to his immediate family.

Official and private correspondence of Alexander Walker during his period as Military Secretary to General James Stuart, as assistant to the Malabar

Commission and then as a Commissioner. After the cession of Malabar to the E.I.Co. by the Treaties of Seringapatam in 1792 this Commission was set up to establish a system for the future government of Malabar. The letters contain much information about the revenue claims of the Zamorin of Calicut, the movements of Tipu Sultan and the Pychy Raja, the campaign leading to the fall of Seringapatam, the pursuit of the dissident Dhondia Wahan and the prospects for settling the administration of Malabar. This period marks the beginning of Walker's lengthy private correspondence with Jonathan Duncan as governor of Bombay and the consolidation of his friendship with General Stuart.

Much of this takes the form of letters to Jonathan Duncan, governor of Bombay, and covers such matters as Walker's efforts to mediate between rivals to the succession in Baroda; his successful campaign against the dissident ~~Malhar~~ *Malhar Rao*; the reform of the Gaikwar's army and the expulsion of the Arab mercenaries from Baroda; the consolidation of the Company's position in the area; the prolonged campaign against Kanhoji, ~~S~~<sup>h</sup>india and Holkar; the difficulty of maintaining and deploying the small subsidiary force; the alleged speculation of Aka Mohomed; the management of the military settlement of Kathiawar and Kutch which delayed Walker's departure from India until 1810; his commitment to the abolition of female infanticide and his nurturing of a team of able assistants such as James Rivett Carnac, Archibald Robertson, James Macmurdo and Samuel Greenwood. MSS.13633-4 are remarkable in that they chart, almost day by day, the course of Colonel Murray's abortive campaigns against Holkar during 1803 and 1804 in the form of letters to

His own literary activities, although little was ever published, brought him into contact with linguists and historians of British India, notably with James Mill. However the most important feature of this period is the commencement, in 1815, of the long series of friendly and revealing exchanges between B.S. Jones of the India Board and Walker about the E.I. Co's policy in India, exchanges which were to continue until Walker's death.

Walker, the elder son of Alexander Walker, had a distinguished career as a lawyer and was a prominent member of the Episcopal Church of Scotland. His correspondence however is almost entirely concerned with family and estate matters at Bowland. There are some earlier letters to Alexander Walker from Lord Chief Baron Robert Dundas of Arniston, 1814-18, mostly about road improvements but including details of Dundas' visit to Rome in 1817-18 just before his death. There is also correspondence in 1813 and 1816 with the architect James Gillespie Graham about the additions to Walker's house at Bowland.
